Dear Ms. Purdy:

Attached via email is the Annual Report pursuant to the requirements of the Ventura County Municipal Stormwater NPDES Permit No. CAS004002/Order No. 10-108 which requires an Annual Storm Water Report (Report) be submitted by December 15th of each year. This Report discusses the Permittees' Permit compliance activities for the period of July 1, 2018, to June 30, 2019, and it includes a description of all activities conducted during the reporting period, an assessment of the Ventura Countywide Stormwater Program's effectiveness, and an evaluation of pollutants detected through the Stormwater Monitoring Program.

This Annual Report was prepared with the cooperation and assistance of the Ventura Countywide Permittees which includes the cities of Camarillo, Fillmore, Moorpark, Ojai, Oxnard, Port Hueneme, Ventura, Santa Paula, Simi Valley, Thousand Oaks, the County of Ventura, and the Ventura County Watershed Protection District. Each Permittee contributed detailed Permit compliance information and data regarding their various stormwater programs.

Some notable accomplishments by the Program and the Permittees this reporting period include:

- Consistently met water quality objectives at seven Ventura County beaches resulting in their removal from the 303(d) impaired water body list.



- Coordinated the Ventura County Coastal Cleanup Day Event, recruited over 3,000 volunteers to 26 different beaches and inland locations, and collected an estimated 12,195 pounds of trash.
- Participated in SCCWRP's Bight '18 Microbiology Coliphage Study and Trash assessment.
- Continued to inform the highest levels of management about the potential programmatic and financial impacts of a new Regional Permit through new and refined communication tools.
- Educated the private development community, including planners and engineers, with a comprehensive training workshop covering Ventura County stormwater quality post construction mitigation requirements.
