Ventura County Watershed Protection District Dear Ms. Arredondo:

Permit The Ventura County Municipal Stormwater NPDES No. CAS004002/Order No. 10-108, and the Regional Phase I MS4 NPDES Permit No. CAS004004/Order No. R4-2021-0105 require an Annual Storm Water Report (Report) be submitted by December 15th of each year. Pursuant to these requirements, the Ventura Countywide Stormwater Quality Management Program Annual Report 2022/23 (Report) has been uploaded to the FTP site: https://ftp.waterboards.ca.gov. This Report presents the Permittees' Permit compliance activities for the period of July 1, 2022, to June 30, 2023. It includes a description of all activities conducted during the reporting period, and an evaluation of pollutants detected through the Stormwater Monitoring Program.

Key components of the uploaded Annual Report include:

- Individual Permittee Annual Report forms and Attachments
- Attachment A and Appendices: Monitoring Report
- Attachment B: Countywide PIPP Report

Preparation of this Annual Report involved collaborative efforts from the Ventura Countywide Permittees, consisting of the cities of Camarillo, Fillmore, Moorpark, Ojai, Oxnard, Port Hueneme, Ventura, Santa Paula, Simi Valley, Thousand Oaks, the County of Ventura, and the Ventura County Watershed Protection District. Each Permittee contributed detailed information regarding their stormwater programs, accessible in their respective Permittee folders.





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During the reporting period, Ventura County Permittees have been working collaboratively to develop Watershed Management Programs (WMPs) for five watersheds that meet the requirements of Section IX of the Regional MS4 Permit. The draft WMPs were submitted to the Los Angeles Regional Water Quality Control Board (LA Regional Board) on September 11, 2023. Until the WMPs are approved, Ventura County Permittees are implementing their existing stormwater programs, including actions within each of the six categories of minimum control measures (MCMs) consistent with 40 CFR section 122.26(d)(2)(iv) in lieu of Part VIII.D through Part VIII.I of the Regional Permit.

The reporting details for each Permittee's MCMs can be found within their individual data folders. These folders contain data reported on the 2010 Permit forms, presented as attachments to Regional Permit Attachment H\_c. Attachment H\_c also includes other information provided by the Permittees where applicable.

In addition to development of the WMPs, during this reporting period the Ventura County Permittees also worked together on developing draft comprehensive Coordinated Integrated Monitoring Programs (CIMPs) for five watersheds within the County. The draft CIMPs were also submitted to the LA Regional Board on September 11, 2023. Until the CIMPs are approved, the Countywide Program continues to implement the monitoring requirements pursuant to Order No. 2010-0108 including MRP No. CI-7388 and pursuant to the most recently approved version of the Monitoring Plans in Table E-2 until the Executive Officer of the Los Angeles Water Board approves the CIMPs.
